Teachers and staff begin on August 27 and 28 with two Superintendent's Days. On those two days, we review important required laws and NYS Education Regulations. Teachers prepare their classrooms for students so everything is ready on Tuesday, September 3, 2024, our first day of school!!!!

What is New this Year?

<u>Family Corn Roast</u> – On Wednesday, August 28 from 4:30 to 5:30 PM, we are inviting families for a Corn Roast and Hot Dog dinner! Our Open House for parents and students will follow from 5:30 to 7 PM when parents and students meet their teacher!

<u>New CSE Chairperson</u> – Mrs. Emily Worden is our new CSE Chair who will also be supporting our Academic Intervention Services (AIS) Program and overseeing counseling services. Mrs. Worden's background is in special education and school improvement in special education.

New Buildings and Grounds Supervisor – Mr. Adam Passage, Class of 2005, is our new B&G Supervisor. Mr. Passage, a custodian, has been at the district for the past several years. It's nice to see a hometown graduate in a leadership role!

New Teachers and Instructional Staff – We welcome two new teachers, Ms. Olivia Ososkalo who will be teaching social studies and Ms. Katie Abel who will be teaching science. Mrs. Michelle Lawrence is teaching 7-12 health and English this year. We are happy to share that Mrs. Jerrica White will be returning to Belleville Henderson School as the typist in our Guidance Office. Our new support staff are: Mrs. Tiffany Whitney and Ms. Zell Bolton Food Service; Mrs. Laura Killenbeck, Teacher Assistant; Ms. Ashley Loura, Ms. Laura Metzler, Mrs. Melanie O'Brien, and Ms. Kelsey Glenn are all new Teacher Aides. Mrs. Terry Sanders is a bus driver. We are happy to welcome all to Belleville Henderson School!

<u>Community Schools Grant</u> – Our North County Families Students Community Schools grant focuses on student achievement, supporting families, student mental health, and students who are having difficulty with school attendance.

<u>Capital Project</u> - This summer we are under construction at both the bus garage and K-12 School. Mr. Staveski, our architect, has an article in this newsletter with more on the capital project.

Finance Updates

<u>Tax Collection Program</u> – Tax Collector, Mrs. Mary Forrester, will collect all taxes at the District. As a cost saving measure, we will not be using the Community Bank, NA as a tax collection site. Starting September 4, 2024, you may pay in person on Mondays and Wednesdays from 3:30 PM to 5:30 PM at the Main Entrance #1. The last day to pay in person is Thursday, October 3 from 3:30 PM to 6:00 PM. No cash or Credit Cards are accepted. Checks and Money Orders are accepted.

Summer School and ARP Grant - The American Rescue Program (ARP) ends September 2024. ARP funded the summer school program. Next year's 2025 Summer School Program will be in the general budget.

Transportation Bus Fleet - We appreciate all those community members who voted on June 18, 2024 for the second budget vote. We eliminated one of two buses, which was \$116,000, to reduce the budget for that vote.

State Aid Projections for the following School Year - Transportation expenditures drive state aid to the district. In the 2025-2026 budget year, the District's Transportation Aid will be reduce due to a reduction in spending of \$116,000.

Long Range Budget — With the reduction in the levy by \$116,000 for 2024-2025, and the reduction in transportation aid in 2025-2026, we are monitoring all spending this school year. The 2025-2026 budget year is carefully being studied, too.

<u>Future Publications</u>— We hope you enjoy our newsletter. We welcome ideas that you would like to see more information about our school. We are seeking community sponsors for future Panther Press Publications to highlight our school!

The safety of our students and staff continues to be our first priority. Our School Safety Officer, Mr. Earl is a retired NYS Trooper. He has a great rapport with our students. We look forward to September 3, 2024 when we are all back together!

Learning Center:

We will be having a learning center in the Middle and High School this school year. The learning center will be scheduled on your child's schedule and will operate like a structured learning environment. The goal for the learning center is to build academic success and prioritize learning. It is important to know that the learning center is not a special education placement or accommodation.

What will occur in the Learning Center?

Organization tips Assignment completion Skill building Assistance is establishing goals, routines and good habits

Who will be in the learning center?

Students who need extra support in any academic area including organization, skill development and a quiet work environment.

The learning center will allow teachers to collaborate with each other in order to provide support to students proactively. Students may move in and out of the learning center as needed throughout the school year. Student data will be reviewed confidentially by the LSS team that will meet monthly. What is a community school?

- They often *collaborate with community organizations and local businesses* to provide programs and services that address the diverse needs of the community, such as after-school tutoring, health clinics, and family engagement activities.
- The holistic approach aims to remove barriers to learning by addressing the social, emotional, and physical well being of students and their families.

Childhood Special Education Services

Early childhood Special Education Services are available for children from birth to the age of 5 or school age. Your child can receive a free evaluation to determine a need for special services. Special services are also free for all children, if deemed necessary after the evaluation process.

Early Intervention Services 0-2 years old

Early Intervention is a program that provides services to developmentally delayed children from birth through 2 years of age. If you have concerns regarding your child's development in the areas of speech and language, motor skills, hearing, vision, or any other areas of development, you can call Jefferson County Public Health Services at 786-3355 for an evaluation.

Preschool Special Education 3-5 years old

Preschool children who have a delay in development may be eligible for special services as well. Developmental problems can occur in any of the following areas:

- Language (talking and understanding)
- Motor (walking and movement)
- Hearing
- Visual
- Other

Each school district in New York State must have a Committee on Preschool Special Education. If you suspect your child may have a problem, you can refer your child to CPSE by contacting Emily Worden at 846-5825 at Belleville Henderson Central School.

Pre-school special education includes evaluation and a variety of special services. There are many choices as to where and how special services can be provided. You have an opportunity for input regarding services for your child. The special services your child receives are developed by the CPSE. The committee consists of you, the chairperson from the school district, the school psychologist, a representative from the county where you live, someone who evaluated your child or can interpret the evaluation, and a pre-school teacher. You are welcome to bring along anyone else you think can be helpful. If you feel that your child is delayed in any of the above areas, please do not hesitate to call our school district and request an evaluation by the CPSE.

If you need further information regarding the referral process to Early Intervention or CPSE, please feel free to call Kathi Zecher, Associate Director of Head Start, Health and Disabilities Services at 782-4900 ext. 242. You may also call Emily Worden, CPSE Chairperson, at 846-5825.

The Social and Emotional Benefit of Regular Attendance

Research has shown the following benefits from consistent and on-time attendance:

- A predictable schedule builds the child's confidence at home and school.
- Student anxiety decreases because they know what to expect from the previous day.
- Children recognize they are part of a community; their peers and teacher expect and include them and miss them when they are gone.
- Ongoing, extended conversations and learning lead to improved student outcomes.
- Children learn to increasingly control their emotions simply by being in a consistent environment and on a schedule every day.
- Students spend more time building on what they learned the day before and less time "catching up" (another decrease in anxiety).
- Parents and families feel more a part of the school community.

What Families Can Do

Elementary K-5

- + Set a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- + Show interest regularly in what your shild has learned.
- + Ask interesting questions about your child's day.
- + Support good attendance habits.

Secondary 6-12

- + Monitor your teen's academic progress and seek help from teachers or other staff when necessary.
- + Encourage your teen to join meaningful afterschool activities that are offered.
- + Ask interesting questions about your teen's day.

A HUGE welcome to Jerrica White!! Jerrica is the newest member to the Guidance Office team. Over the course of the school year, I will be meeting regularly with your student to talk about their plans for life after BHCS. During these meetings with students we discuss what they would like to do and how to get there. I would love to have your input as well. If you would like to meet with me and your child please contact me to arrange a time and date. I am very flexible about times. If you can only meet early in the morning or late in the day, we can arrange a time that works for you.

In the beginning of October I will be taking the seniors to JCC's Higher Education Day. There is also an evening session open for all students. If you would like more information please reach out to me in the Guidance Office. In November the seniors will attend WorkForce Connections, a mock interview with numerous of careers, businesses and agencies in attendance. Also in October the 11th graders have the opportunity to take the PSAT's here at BHCS.

Another event in November to keep an eye out for, we will hold a College & Financial Aid Night here at BHCS. I bring in a college representative and someone from NYSED who specializes in financial aid for college

Through out the fall we will have numerous college representatives coming to BHCS to meet with students. Over the course of the entire school year we have Career Chats once or twice a month. The presenters are from various careers fields. They will to talk with any student interested in that particular career filed. JFFERSON COMMUNITY COLLEGE INSTANTADMIT DAY

In December, I have admissions representatives from Jefferson Community College come to BHCS and I have ALL the seniors fill out an application for JCC. There is no fee for the application and if the student does not want to go to JCC they don't have to do anything to cancel the application. I provide a lunch for the students. It gives the students an opportunity to meet with, and ask any questions about the application process or about college in general.

2023 Capital Improvement Project

You may have noticed a lot of activity at the school and bus garage this summer. We are nearing completion of the 2023 Capital Improvement Project which the District superintendent, key staff members, the District Architect and Engineers and the Construction Management firm have been planning since the Building Conditions Survey was completed in 2020. With this project, the district has addressed key initiatives that includes safety and security, energy efficiency and will enhance and extend the useful life of the existing building. Phase 1 of the project was completed in the fall of 2023 and included a roof replacement at the bus garage. Earlier this summer, contractors began work to replace the public address system, security cameras and lighting in the parking lots. Additional security measures include new doors and a security window will be installed at the main entrance. A new make-up air unit for the kitchen will be replaced and the two air handling units at the gym will arrive in December for installation after the basketball season is completed. Ventilation and cooling will be addressed at select offices. Other work will include the replacement of the bus lift, reconstruction of the kiln room, new side walks ,masonry restorations and upgrades to finishes at both buildings. Much of the work will be completed by early September with the entire project scheduled to be completed by May 1, 2025.

BELLEVILLE HENDERSON CENTRAL SCHOOL ASBESTOS NOTICE

All Belleville Henderson Central School District buildings have had an inspection for the presence of asbestos-containing building materials according to the Asbestos Hazardous Emergency Response Act (AHERA) of 1986. Under the Federal Guidelines, the buildings were completely inspected for asbestos-containing materials. A copy of the Management Plan is available in the Main Office, as well as the District Office. Every six months surveillance is done of the asbestos-containing material. Every three years, a mandatory re-inspection takes place in each area that is known to contain these materials.

ATTENDANCE

Parents of students who are late or absent will be called on a daily basis to check on their attendance. We will be utilizing Parent Square again this year to make these calls. If you expect that your student will be late or absent, please call the health office phone. Calls can be made before school hours by calling 846-5323 and leaving a message on the answering machine. If you do not call in before 8:00 a.m., please expect a phone call from the school to inquire about your student's absence.

Schools are responsible for your student's learning. Schools, however, cannot do their job if your student is absent. Learning builds day by day. A student who misses a day of school misses a day of learning.

Here's How You Can Improve Your Student's Attendance

- 1. Talk with your student about the importance of attending school regularly.
- 2. Avoid scheduling family trips during school hours.
- 3. Help your student stay healthy by eating nutritious food and getting enough sleep and exercise.
- 4. Discuss with your student what is happening at school.
- 5. Support school rules and consequences.
- 6. Show your student why education is important.
- 7. Set a good example for your student.

WRITTEN EXCUSES FOR ABSENTEEISM

It is necessary for the school to have information on file concerning absenteeism during the school year. When your student is absent for any reason please send in a written excuse with your student the day he/she returns to school. Excuses for students in grades Pre K through grade 12 should be taken to the Main Office.


