Belleville Henderson School District Safety Committee would like to start by letting everyone know that here at Belleville Henderson, we take the safety of every student, staff member and visitor, very seriously. Studies have shown that when schools provide a safe and secure learning environment for students, in this case your children, they have better attendance, improved grades and less mental health issues.

This said, Belleville Henderson has many safety policies in place that are proven effective and highly recommended by state and federal agencies, some are even mandated due to the proven effectiveness. Just one example of these safety measures has proven over recent years to be one of the most effective safety measures and has been adopted by nearly all public and private schools. This safety measure is the limiting of access into the building itself, to a 'single point of entry' for **ALL** visitors during school hours. While this may seem for some, to be unfriendly, or an unwelcoming way to enter the school building, this is a first line approach that minimizes cross traffic. This safety measure also allows us to keep a visitor log for documentation of who's in our building and actually minimizes confusion for the administration and staff.

By being able to control the point of entry, we greatly minimize the possibility of even the smallest threat to safety and/or security, leading to a more manageable, productive and relaxed environment for the students to learn and the teachers to share their knowledge with students.

In this newsletter, you will find lots of pertinent information as we enter 2025 and continue through the remainder of the school year.

First, please take a moment to meet and welcome the newest members of our staff who have joined the District this year. They are highlighted in this newsletter and we are proud to have them as part of our Panther team.

Our annual Winter Concert was held on Wednesday, December 11 and highlighted the tremendous musical talent displayed by our students. We hope you had a chance to attend and enjoy the sounds of the holiday season. Congratulations and thank you to Mrs. McGrath and Mrs. Gleason of our Music Department for their efforts and work to make this year's concert a huge success. We also want to thank all of our chorus and band students for their hard work and their families for their ongoing support and encouragement.

The new year will mean preparation from the District on a proposed budget for 2025-26. Our budget development process will begin in earnest in January. More details on the proposed spending plan will be released in the weeks and months ahead. The following budget meeting dates with the Board of Education have been scheduled: January 13, January 27, February 10, March 10 and March 31. Interested members of the community are encouraged to attend these public meetings.

Also on the agenda for 2025 are EV buses. The New York State Education Department is requiring all school districts to develop a plan for these buses and the matter is currently being studied by the Board of Education. We have secured a \$345,000 grant from the Environmental Protection Agency and are continuing to seek further funding avenues as well. The study will also look at ways to convert our bus garage to accommodate EV buses. The Board of Education will be discussing the matter as part of the upcoming budget process and determine whether to purchase an EV bus for the District.

Have a safe, healthy, and happy new year. We thank all of you for your continued support of Belleville Henderson Central School. Together we are Panther Strong!


